

Contribution Regulations

of Ostfalia University of Applied Sciences Braunschweig/Wolfenbüttel University
("Ostfalia") valid from 01/09/2024

1. The amount of the basic contribution that all students of Ostfalia are required to pay for the fulfillment of the tasks of the student body is set (pursuant to the StuPa minutes of 08/04/2024) at €17.00 as of 01/09/2024. In accordance with the resolution of the Student Parliament of 21/03/2016, €0.50 will be allocated to the Erich Zillmer Foundation and €0.50 to the Ostfalia University Foundation.
2. Location-specific and/or place-of-study-specific models may be developed that increase the contribution by the amount necessary to participate in a "semester ticket model" for the use of public transportation. Recommendations of the respective general assemblies pursuant to § 17 para. 2 and § 5 para. 1 of the statutes of the student body are required for this purpose. The Student Parliament decides on accession to the respective model. A recommendation of the general assembly and a resolution of the Student Parliament are not required if the amount necessary for participation changes within the framework of the contracts with the respective transport companies. The contribution for Ostfalia's students for the semester ticket will be reported to the Registrar's Office (Immatrikulationsbüro) in accordance with the contracts with the transport companies. This contribution will be collected together with the basic contribution referred to in no. 1. With regard to applications for reimbursement, the student body has discretionary authority.
3. The contribution for students of Ostfalia, consisting of the basic contribution referred to in no. 1 plus the current semester ticket price, will be collected at the time of enrolment or re-registration at the beginning of each semester via the Registrar's Office of Ostfalia. The amounts can be viewed on the Ostfalia website (Enrolment / Re-registration for the following semester).
4. These contribution regulations were adopted at the Student Parliament meeting on 08/04/2024.
